RULES AND REGULATIONS

1 The Show will open at 8.15am.

2 Dogs will be received at any time but it is the exhibitors responsibility to ensure exhibits are available for judging when required

3 judging will commence at 9.15am

4 Exhibits may be removed from the Show after their judging has been completed. The show will close half an hour after all judging has been completed

5 ENTRY FEES: Members: £13.00 first entry per dog (except veteran); Non Members: £15.00 first entry per dog (except veteran); for all subsequent classes with same dog £3.00. ENTER 5 DOGS OR MORE FOR A FLAT RATE OF £55 MEMBERS - £65 NON MEMBERS. Veteran £3.00; Not For Competition £3.00 per Dog. To take advantage of members rates all partners and owners must be members and fees are as follows : Single £5 Joint £6; Family £6.50; CATALOGUES :£2.50 with entry, (on the day £3.00). Ads in Catalogue £5.00.

6 PRIZE MONEY: No Prize Money will be paid at this Show except in Stakes Classes

7 The Committee reserves to itself the right to refuse entries.

8 Puppies under six calendar months of age on the first day of the Show are not eligible for exhibition.

9 The mating of bitches within the precincts of the Show is forbidden.

10 BEST PUPPY IN SHOW (if scheduled) Where a Best Puppy in Show competition is scheduled the Best Puppy in Show is a puppy which has competed and is unbeaten by any other puppy exhibited at the same show. A puppy is a dog of six and not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the first day of the Show. Where the Best in Show is a Puppy it may, at the discretion of the judge be awarded Best Puppy in Show respectively. Where the Reserve Best in Show is a puppy which has only been beaten by an adult dog it may, at the discretion of the judge be Best Puppy in Show respectively. Consequently, selection of Best Puppy in Show must follow the selection of Best in Show

11 BEST IN SHOW Best in Show must be selected from the exhibits declared Best of Sex but only if they have received a first prize in a class at the same show. If a Reserve Best in Show is to be selected, the eligible dogs are those declared Best Opposite Sex and the Reserve Best of Sex to the exhibit declared Best in Show.

12 Exhibits will not be admitted to Best in Show competition after a period of ten minutes has elapsed since the announcement that exhibits are required for judging, unless they have been unavoidably delayed by previous judging not being completed on time, and then only with the special permission of the Show Management.

13 Exhibitors must not pick up dogs by their tails and leads when lifting them nor handle a dog in a manner which causes its feet not touch the ground when on the move. This is not acceptable. Exhibitors should note that such practice would constitute harsh handling and reports of such practice will be referred to the Committee under Kennel Club Show Regulation F11.

14 All exhibitors must be familiar with Kennel Club Regulation F (Annex B) Regulations for the Preparation of Dogs for Exhibition.

15 All dogs resident outside the UK must be issued with a Kennel Club Authority to Compete number before entry to the show/event can be made. All overseas entries without an Authority to Compete number will be returned to the exhibitor/competitor.

16 DOGS IN VEHICLES ON HOT DAYS Your dog is vulnerable and at risk during hot weather and the Kennel Club offers the following guidance to help guide you through the do's and don'ts travelling to and whilst at KC licensed events. When travelling to a show please take a moment to consider whether the route to the show is on a busy holiday route and leave earlier to avoid increased time in traffic jams. If your vehicle is not air conditioned seriously consider whether travelling to the show is a good idea at all. The vehicle shoul dbe as fully ventillated as possible and plenty of stops should be taken , with lots of water available to drink. Ensure your dog is not sitting in full sunlight. There should be a free flow of air around the dog. When at the show never leave your dog in the vehicle. Keep your dog in the shade – take your own umbrella and always have plenty water available to drink so your dog stays well hydrated. Avoid your dog taking part in unnecessary exertion, or from standing in exposed sunlight for extended lengths of time. Remember, if you feel hot your dog is likely to feel much hotter and dehydrated and this could lead to dire results. Please look after your dog's welfare . WARNING: IF YOUR DOG IS FOUND TO BE AT RISK FORCIBLE ENTRY TO YOUR VEHICLE COULD BE NECESSARY WITHOUT LIABILITY FOR ANY DAMAGE CAUSED.

17 Anyone whose dog is entered at a Kennel Club licensed event should take all reasonable steps to ensure the needs of their dog(s) are met and should not put a dog's health and welfare at risk by any action, default, omission or otherwise. Breach of Kennel Club Regulations in this respect may be referred to the Board for disciplinary action under theRoyal Kennel Club Rules and Regulations. The use of pinch collars, electronic shock collars, or prong collars, is not permitted at any show licensed by the Kennel Club. This shall apply at the venue or within the precincts of the show

18 Not for Competition entries will be accepted. Details of each dog so entered must be recorded on the entry form and must be Kennel Club registered.

19 No modifications will be made to the schedule except by permission of the Board of the Royal Kennel Club, which will be followed by advertisement in the Canine press wherever possible.

20 Any owner, exhibitor or handler or other person in charge of a dog is requested to remove as soon as possible any fouling caused by their dog(s) at any Kennel Club licensed event including car parks, caravan parks and approaches. Adequate receptacles for the disposal of such fouling will be provided.

21 Gangways must be kept clear at all times. Any obstructions, including dog boxes or cages, left in gangways will be removed by the Show Management

22 Should the judge be prevented from fulfilling his/her engagement the committee reserve to themselves the right of appointing another judge to fulfil his/her duties. Exhibitors are at liberty to withdraw from competition but no entrance fee can be returned

23 The owner, exhibitor, handler or other person in charge of a dog at Royal Kennel Club licensed events must at all times ensure that the dog is kept under proper control whilst at the licensed venue, including its environs, car and caravan park and approaches. This Regulation applies before (at any time during the set up period at the venue) during the event and afterwards (at any time during the breakdown of the event)

24 Exhibitors/visitors will be liable for any damage caused to he venue by themselves or their property

25 Exhibitors are advised that the use of mobile telephones is prohibited in the vicinity of the ring.

26 Exhibitors whose cheques are returned by their bank for any reason will be liable to settle the amount due plus a Bank Chrge of £35 and an administration fee of £10. Any unpaid amounts will be reported to the Royal Kennel Club.

27 Exhibitors are advised that no responsibility can be accepted for cash sent through the post

28 Every exhibitor shall ensure that whilst the dog is being exhibited its handler shall display the correct ring number.

29 Special Provision – Puppies aged 4 months and up to 1 day under 6 months on the first day of the show will be admitted to the show, by permission of The Royal Kennel Club, and must be entered in the Not for Competition Class.

DEFINITIONS OF CLASSES

In the following definitions, a Challenge Certificate includes any show award that counts towards the title of Champion under the rules of any governing body recognised by the Kennel Club. Wins at Championship Shows in breed classes where Challenge Certificates are not on offer shall be counted as wins at Open Shows. In the case of a dog owned in partnership and entered in Members' classes or competing for Members' Specials each partner must, if taking advantage of cheaper membership fees for entry – both/all owners must be members at the time of entry of the Society. In estimating the number of awards won, all wins up to and including the seventh day before the date of closing of entries shall be counted when entering for any class i.e. **Saturday 16th September, 2023**. Wins in Variety classes do not count for entry in Breed classes but when entering for Variety classes, wins in both Breed and Variety classes must be counted. First prizes awarded in any classes as defined as Special do not count towards eligibility. If an exhibitor reports before the judging of a class or classes that a dog has been entered which is ineligible, the exhibitor may choose one of the following options:-

(1) WITHDRAWAL: The dog may be withdrawn from competition subject to the conditions of Regulations F.(1).19

(2) TRANSFER: a) If a dog is ineligible for a class or classes as regards its colour, sex, weight or height the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the equivalent class or classes for the correct colour, sex, weight or height and in the event of there being no

equivalent class, Minor Puppy and Puppy excepted, to the Open class for the correct colour, sex, weight or height.(b) If an exhibit is entered incorrectly in a Minor Puppy Class, Puppy Class or Junior Class, which is over age but under 12 calendar months of age, 18 calendar months of age or 24 calendar months of age respectively the Show Secretary shall transfer the exhibit to the Puppy Class, Junior Class or Yearling Class respectively for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight or height and in the event of there being no Puppy, Junior or Yearling Class to the Open Class for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight or height.c) For any reason other than the above, the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the Open class for the correct colour, sex, weight or height. PLEASE NOTE If an exhibit arrives late and misses a class, even if it is the only class in which IT is entered, the dog may not be transferred to any other class. **MINOR PUPPY**:For dogs of six and not exceeding nine calendar months of age on first day of the Show

PUPPY: For dogs of six and not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.

JUNIOR: For dogs of six and not exceeding eighteen calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.

NOVICE: For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate or three or more First Prizes at Open and Championship Shows (Minor Puppy, Puppy, and Special Puppy classes excepted whether restricted or not)

YEARLING: For dogs of twelve and not exceeding twenty-four calendar months of age on first day of the Show.

POST GRADUATE: For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate/CACIB/CAC/Green Stars or five or more First Prizes at Championship Shows in Post Graduate, Minor Limit, Mid Limit, Limit and Open classes, whether restricted or not where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed

LIMIT For dogs which have not become show Champions under the Kennel Club Regulations or under the rules of any governing body recognised by the Kennel Club, or won 3 or more CC/CACIB/CAC/Green Stars or won 7 or more First Prizes in all at Championship Shows in Limit and Open Classes, confined to the breed, whether restricted or not, at Shows where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed.

OPEN: For all dogs of the breed for which the class is provided and eligible for entry at the Show.

VETERAN: For dogs of not less than seven years of age on the first day of the Show.

NOT FOR COMPETITION Societies may at their discretion accept Not for Competition entries. Societies my accept such entries from breeds of dog not included within the title of the society and at shows held over more than one day, such entries may be accepted on the day from any breed. Special Provision – Puppies aged 4 months and up to 1 day under months on the first day of the show will be admitted to the show, by permission of The Kennel Club, and must be entered in the Not for Competition Class.

REGULATIONS FOR THE PREPARATION OF DOGS FOR EXHIBITION F(B)

1. These Regulations must be observed when a dog is prepared for exhibition and/or exhibited at any Kennel Club Licensed event. Objections may be referred to the General Committee for disciplinary action under these Show Regulations and/or for disciplinary action under Kennel Club Rule 11.

(a) A dog found to have been exhibited in breach of these Regulations will automatically be disqualified from exhibition at the show and from any award gained there at. (b) Unless the exhibitor provides a satisfactory explanation for the dog being exhibited in breach of these Regulations then he/she may be subject to further penalties of either a fine or as listed under Rule 11.

2 a) No substance which alters the natural colour, texture or body of the coat may be present in the dog's coat for any purpose at any time during the Show. No substance which alters the natural colour of any external part of the dog may be present at any time during the Show. b) Any other substance (other than water) which may be used in the preparation of a dog for exhibition must not be allowed to remain in the coat or on any other part of the dog at the time of exhibition.

3. No act or operation which alters the natural conformation of a dog or any part thereof may be performed except:-

- (a) Operations certified to the satisfaction of the General Committee.
- (b) The removal of dew claws of any breed.
- (c) Operations to prevent breeding provided that such operations are notified to the Kennel Club before neutered dogs are shown.

Nor must anything be done calculated in the opinion of the General Committee to deceive.

4. The General Committee without previous notice may order an examination of any dog or dogs at any Show. Any examination thus ordered will be made by a person having executive authority who shall have a written directive from the Kennel Club in their possession. Samples may be taken for further examination and analysis.

5. An individual has the right to lodge an objection to a dog only if he/she is the owner or handler of a dog competing in the same breed or class. An objection may however, be lodged by an official of the Show or by anyone so deputed by the K.C. It will be the responsibility of the individual who lodges the objection or the official (as appropriate), to substantiate the grounds for the objection. The Kennel Club will substantiate the grounds for an objection made on its behalf.

6. Any objection by an individual related to an infringement of these Regulations must be made in writing to the Show Secretary at his/her office before the close of the Show and the individual must produce evidence of identity at the time of lodging the complaint

HEALTH AND SAFETY DECLARATION

Exhibitors and spectators are reminded that, just as the Basset Hound Club of Scotland has a responsibility to ensure the health and safety of all those attending their event, exhibitors show at their own risk if conditions are not ideal and have a duty and responsibility for their own safety. They are therefore expected to take great care to avoid guide ropes, uneven surfaces and other hazards which are inevitable and integral elements of a dog show. Those bringing and using portable items of equipment such as folding chairs, trolleys, cages and grooming tables also have a responsibility to ensure that their tools, equipment and collapsible furniture is used and erected safely and does not constitute a hazard to others. Exhibitors are also reminded that they should wear appropriate clothing and footwear for the prevailing conditions on the site. No cooking stoves or portable barbecues are allowed within the precincts of the show.

DIRECTIONS TO VENUE

Crawfordjohn Public Hall, Manse Road, Crawfordjohn ML12 6SR

Crawfordjohn is conveniently situated less than 4 miles from the Motorway along a quiet road.

From the South - M6 & M74 (M)

Leave the A74(M) at junction 13 (Abington Services) onto the B7078 and at the roundabout go straight on following signs for Douglas and Crawfordjohn. (NOTE: do not take the first unclassified road to Crawfordjohn). As you enter Crawfordjohn on the B740 just past the 30mph signs turn left and continue to the end of the road, then turn left and take 1st right into venue car park.

From the North - M74

Leave the M74 at junction 13 (Abington Services) and follow signs for Glasgow M74 then follow B7078 and B740 to cross the motorway and at the roundabout take the B7078 signed Douglas and Crawfordjohn. As you enter Crawfordjohn on the B740 just past the 30mph signs turn left, continue to the end of the road, then turn left taking 1st right into car park.
