**Brian Staveley Perpetual Challenge Trophy** (Donated by the Club in Memory of our Late Secretary) will be awarded annually to the Border Terrier achieving the most points at the three club shows. points being restricted to those won in Post Graduate, Limit, Open and Veteran Classes and Mid Limit at the Ch. Show First = 4 points ~ Second = 3 points ~ Third = 2 points ~ Fourth = 1 point In addition the owner will receive a commemorative gift

**Fred Mitchell Trophy** for the winner of most points over all classes with exception of the Brace at the Club's three shows. First = 4 point ~ Second = 3 points ~ Third = 2 points ~ Fourth = 1 point

**Swallowfield Stud Trophy** - Presented by Lady Russell for the sire who has the greatest number of immediate progeny having first prizes at the seven Border Terrier Clubs' Championship Shows with CCs on offer during the preceding year to December 31st.

**Margaret Warren Memorial Trophy** - presented by Paul Warren and Brian Elliot for a young exhibitor who has shown promise in handling in the main classes of our 3 shows in 2019 (not including the Brace or the Junior Handling classes).

### Judging at Partnership Shows

Due to the current increase in partnership shows being held, the Kennel Club would like to clarify its position with regard to judging at such events.

Partnership shows are those which are held where a host society and another club share a venue and facilities in order to allow exhibitors the opportunity to exhibit at two events during the duration of the host society's show. In most cases, the host society's event will be a general championship show held over a number of days.

At partnership shows judges must not officiate at one show and enter or handle a dog for exhibition at the other show including exhibiting a different breed on another day to that which they are to judge. Partnership shows are defined as shows where the host club and other clubs share a venue and other facilities to allow exhibitors the opportunity to exhibit at each show.

### Advisory Notes – Additional Rules and Regulations

- I. Should any judge be prevented from fulfilling their engagement, the Committee reserves to themselves the right of appointing other judges to fulfil their duties. Exhibitors are at liberty to withdraw from competition but no entry fees can be refunded.
- II. Any owner, competitor or other person in charge of a dog is required to remove as soon as possible any fouling caused by their dog(s) at any Kennel Club licensed venue and within the environs of that event including car and caravan parks and approaches. Adequate receptacles for the disposal of such fouling will be provided.
- III. The Committee will do its utmost to ensure the safety of the dogs brought for exhibition but it must be clearly understood by exhibitors and all other persons at the Show that the Committee will not be responsible for the loss or damage to any dogs or property, or personal injury whether arising from accident or any other cause whatsoever.
- IV. An announcement prior to the date of closing of entries in Our Dogs of any alteration or addition made by the Committee to the schedule or in these Rules shall be sufficient notice thereof.
- V. All children must be kept under control and parents will be held responsible for any damage caused and charges incurred.
- VI. Please do not obstruct gangways with **cages, pens, grooming tables, trolleys and dogs**. Storage space will be made available for trolleys/cages.\*\*
- VII. If in the opinion of the Show Secretary, Show Manager or Judge any dog is considered not in a fit state for exhibition owing to a disease, savage disposition, or any other cause, the dog may be excluded or removed from the show the dog must not be brought into the Show at any time under any circumstances.
- VIII. No animal other than an exhibit duly entered at the show will be allowed within the precincts of the show during its continuance.
- IX. The owner, exhibitor, handler or other person in charge of a dog at a Kennel Club licensed event must at all times ensure that the dog is kept under proper control whilst at the licensed venue, including its environs, car and caravan parks and approaches. This regulation applies before (at any time during the set up period at the venue), during the event and afterwards (at any time during the breakdown of the event)
- X. A dog may be disqualified by the Board from any award, whether an objection has been lodged or not, if proved amongst other things to have been a) registered or recorded as having been bred by the scheduled judge, this shall not apply to a judge appointed in an emergency; b) exhibited with out payment of the appropriate entry fees.
- XI. Every exhibitor shall ensure that whilst the dog is being exhibited, its handler shall display the correct ring number.

### Additional Guidance on F Regulation Amendments

Regulations now stipulate that competition in AV/Stakes classes has no bearing on the main Breed competition at a show and it is therefore acceptable for beaten dogs to be eligible to challenge in Best Puppy In Group, Best In Group, Best Puppy In Show and Best In Show.

The regulation preventing Best Puppy in show from competing in subsequent competition has been made redundant.

Dogs declared Best in Show and Reserve Best in Show do not need to be withdrawn from subsequent competition.

18. Not for Competition entries will be accepted. Details of each dog so entered must be recorded on the entry form and must be Kennel Club Registered.
  19. No modifications will be made to the schedule except by permission of the Board of the Kennel Club, which will be followed by advertisement in the Canine Press wherever possible.
  20. All dogs must be registered. Where a change of ownership of a registered dog takes place the transfer must be at the Kennel Club previous to the show and applied for before the closing date of entries.
  21. One dog may be entered in several classes if eligible.
  22. In all cases the decision of the judge will be final, except where fraud, misrepresentation or breaking the rules is discovered or bona fide mistakes are made by the judge (Vide Kennel Club Rule 22c)
  23. Should the judge be prevented from fulfilling the engagement the committee reserves the right to appoint another judge to fulfil the duties. Exhibitors are at liberty to withdraw from competition but no entry fee can be returned (vide Kennel Club Rule 22c and 20.1)
  24. Exhibitors making entries at this show must abide by the rules and regulations of the Kennel Club. All entries at this show are sent without condition in any shape or form. All dogs shown must be the unconditional property of the exhibitor in whose name they are entered and must be entered in such names as granted by the Kennel Club.
  25. The committee will be empowered to exclude any dog which is not in a fit state for exhibition from disease, vice or other cause whatsoever and to cause its removal should such symptoms exhibit themselves during the show.
  26. The committee will not be responsible for the loss or damage to a dog or dogs or any property arising neither from accidents or any cause whatsoever, nor for the loss or act of omission of themselves, their officers, servants or others and it is on this understanding that entries are accepted.
  27. **All exhibitors and handlers are required to clean up any fouling by the dog(s) in their charge.**

### **KEEPING YOUR DOG UNDER CONTROL:**

The Border Terrier Club Committee have been concerned recently that a minority number of dogs have shown aggression to other dogs in and out of the ring. Will all exhibitors note to please control your dogs throughout the show, to ensure a pleasant experience for everyone at the show. Dogs showing aggression towards other dogs or people cannot be tolerated.

Please see in particular, paragraph Viii of the KC's SPECIMEN SCHEDULE – ANNEX B Advisory Notes – Additional Rules and Regulations, reproduced elsewhere in this schedule, which advises: "If in the opinion of the Show Secretary, Show Manager or Judge any dog is considered not in a fit state for exhibition owing to a disease, savage disposition, or any other cause, the dog may be excluded or removed from the show the dog must not be brought into the Show at any time under any circumstances. No animal other than an exhibit duly entered at the show will be allowed within the precincts of the show during its continuance."

### **DIRECTIONS TO THE VENUE**

The Exhibition Hall is situated approx. 1/4 mile from Junction 43 M6

### **ONLINE ENTRIES**

The facility to enter online is available. Please be aware that the cost charged by the printers to the exhibitor is an admin charge of £1.20 per order (no matter how many dogs/bitches are entered), which will be added into your entry fees when you choose to enter on-line.

### **JUNIOR HANDLING**

There will be 2 Junior Handling classes to take place in the interval. Entries will be taken at the show. Dogs must have already been entered for competition in the show classes. Judge to be announced on the day. Rosettes for Best Junior Handler and First to Reserve in each class.

EXHIBITORS SHOULD NOTE THAT THE BANK CHARGES INCURRED BY THE CLUB THROUGH INCORRECTLY COMPLETED OR DISHONOURED CHEQUES IN RESPECT OF ENTRIES WILL BE PASSED ON TO THE EXHIBITOR CONCERNED. FAILURE TO PAY ENTRY FEES AND/OR BANK CHARGES WILL BE REFERRED TO THE KENNEL CLUB.

### **USE OF ELECTRICAL EQUIPMENT AT SHOWS**

The Kennel Club is becoming increasingly concerned at the amount of electrical equipment being used by exhibitors at shows, including hair dryers and hair straighteners and other grooming devices.

Electrical equipment should not be brought to shows unless absolutely necessary. In rare instances where it might be required, it should be PAT tested and permission sought from the secretary of the show before it is used.

The Kennel Club has also been informed of recent instances of exhibitors commandeering certain areas of a venue in order to have access to power points so as to use electrical grooming equipment. This is totally unacceptable and particularly unfair on the breeds whose allocated areas have been cramped because of this selfish behaviour.

In accordance with the Kennel Club guidelines, exhibitors must display exhibit number/owner identification on their crate, cage or container at all times.

## RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. The Show will open at 8.45 a.m.
2. Dogs will be received at any time but it is the exhibitors responsibility to ensure that exhibits are available for judging when required.
3. Judging will commence at 9.30 a.m.
4. Exhibits may be removed from the Show after their judging has been completed. The Show will close half an hour after all judging has been completed.
5. ENTRY FEES: £10.00 per dog per class for the first entry, subsequent entries £2.00 per dog per class. Brace (Class 22) - £2.00 per class. Not for Competition £2.00 per dog. Junior Handling Free. Catalogues £3.00 paid with entries - £3.50 on show day. See front page and notes in classification page regarding how to enter online.
6. The following Prize Money will be paid in all classes except Class 22. First £5.00 : Second £4.00 : Third £3.00 : Reserve £2.00 : VHC £1.00  
In Class 22 (Brace) the entry fees will be divided as follows:- First - 50% : Second - 30%  
The Committee reserves to itself the right to refuse entries.
8. Puppies under six calendar months of age on the first day of the Show are not eligible for exhibition.
9. The mating of bitches within the precincts of the Show is forbidden.
10. **BEST PUPPY IN SHOW:** Where a Best Puppy in Show competition is scheduled the Best Puppy in Show is a puppy which has competed and is unbeaten by any other puppy exhibited at the same Show. A puppy is a dog of six and not exceeding 12 calendar months of age on the first day of the Show. Where the Best in Show is a Puppy it should automatically be awarded Best Puppy in Show. Where the Reserve Best in Show is a Puppy which has only been beaten by an adult dog it should also automatically be Best Puppy in Show. Consequently, selection of Best Puppy in Show must follow the selection of Best in Show.
11. **BEST IN SHOW:** Best in Show must be selected from the exhibits declared Best of Sex. If a Reserve Best in Show is to be selected, the eligible dogs are those declared Best Opposite Sex and Reserve Best of Sex to the exhibit declared Best in Show.
12. Exhibits will not be admitted to Best in Show competition after a period of ten minutes has elapsed since the announcement that exhibits are required for judging, unless they have been unavoidably delayed by previous judging not completed on time, and then only with the special permission of the Show Management.
13. Exhibitors must not pick up dogs by their tails and leads when lifting them nor handle a dog in a manner which causes its feet not to touch the ground when on the move. This is not acceptable. Exhibitors should note that such practice would constitute harsh handling and reports of such practice will be referred to the committee under Kennel Club Show Regulation F11.
14. All exhibitors must be familiar with Kennel Club Regulation F (Annex B) Regulations for the Preparation of Dogs for Exhibition.
15. All dogs resident outside the UK must be issued with a Kennel Club Authority to Compete number before entry to the show/event can be made. All overseas entries without an Authority to Compete number will be returned to the exhibitor/competitor.
16. **DOGS IN VEHICLES ON HOT DAYS.** Anyone whose dog is entered at a Kennel Club licensed event should take all reasonable steps to ensure the needs of their dog(s) are met, and should not put a dog's health and welfare at risk by any action, default, omission or otherwise. Breach of Kennel Club Regulations in this respect may be referred to the Board for disciplinary action under the Kennel Club Rules and Regulations. Your dog is vulnerable and at risk during hot weather and the Kennel Club offers the following guidance to help guide you through the do's and don'ts travelling to and whilst at KC licenced events.
  - When travelling to a show please take a moment to consider whether the route to the show is on a busy holiday route, and leave earlier to avoid increased time in traffic jams.
  - If your vehicle is not air-conditioned seriously consider whether travelling to the show is a good idea at all.
  - The vehicle should be as fully ventilated as possible, and plenty of stops should be taken, with lots of water available to drink.
  - Ensure your dog is not sitting in full sunlight. There should be plenty of free flowing air around the dog.
  - When at the show, never leave your dog in the vehicle.
  - Keep the dog in the shade - take your own shade for example a large umbrella and always have plenty of water available to drink so your dog stays well hydrated.
  - Avoid your dog taking part in unnecessary exertion, or from standing in exposed sunlight for extended lengths of time.Remember, if you feel hot your dog is very likely to feel much hotter and dehydrated, and this could lead to dire results. Please look after your dog's welfare.  
**WARNING: IF YOUR DOG IS FOUND TO BE AT RISK FORCIBLE ENTRY TO YOUR VEHICLE MAY BE NECESSARY WITHOUT LIABILITY FOR ANY DAMAGE CAUSED.**  
Anyone whose dog is entered at a Kennel Club licensed event should take all reasonable steps to ensure the needs of their dog(s) are met, and should not put a dog's health and welfare at risk by any action, default, omission or otherwise. Breach of Kennel Club Regulations in this respect may be referred to the Board for disciplinary action under Kennel Club Rules and Regulations. The use of pinch collars, electronic shock collars, or prong collars, is not permitted at any show licensed by the Kennel Club. This shall apply at the venue or within the precincts of the show.
17. **Right to refuse entries.** Exhibitors/Competitors are reminded that show societies have the right

In the following definitions, a Challenge Certificate includes any Show award that counts towards the title of Champion under the Rules of any governing body recognised by the Kennel Club. Wins at Championship Shows in breed classes where Challenge Certificates are not on offer shall be counted as wins at Open Shows.

In the case of a dog owned in partnership and entered in Members' classes or competing for Members' Specials each partner must at the time of entry be a member of the Society.

In estimating the number of awards won, all wins up to and including the seventh day before the date of closing of postal entries shall be counted when entering for any class i.e.: **25th February, 2019**. Wins in Variety classes do not count for entry in Breed classes but when entering in Variety classes, wins in both Breed and Variety classes must be counted. A first prize does not include a Special Prize of whatever value.

If an exhibitor reports before the judging of a class or classes that a dog has been entered which is ineligible, the exhibitor may choose one of the following options:-

(1) **WITHDRAWAL:** The dog may be withdrawn from competition subject to the conditions of Regulation 20.

(2) **TRANSFER:** a) If a dog is ineligible for a class or classes as regards its colour, sex, weight or height the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the equivalent class or classes for the correct colour, sex, weight or height and, in the event of there being no equivalent class, Minor Puppy and Puppy excepted to the Open class for the correct colour, sex, weight or height.

b) For an exhibit entered incorrectly in a Minor Puppy Class, Puppy Class or Junior Class, which is over age but under 12 calendar months of age, 18 calendar months of age or 24 calendar months of age respectively the show secretary shall transfer the exhibit to the Puppy Class, Junior Class, or Yearling Class respectively for the correct colour, sex, weight or height and in the event of there being no Puppy, Junior or Yearling Class to the Open Class for the correct colour, sex, weight or height.

c) For any reason other than the above, the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the Open class for the correct colour, sex, weight or height.

d) If an exhibit arrives late and misses a class, even if it is the only class in which the dog is entered, the dog may not be transferred to any other class.

<b>MINOR PUPPY</b>	For dogs of six and not exceeding nine calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.
<b>PUPPY</b>	For dogs of six and not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.
<b>JUNIOR</b>	For dogs of six and not exceeding eighteen calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.
<b>YEARLING</b>	For dogs of twelve and not exceeding twenty four calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.
<b>SPECIAL BEGINNERS</b>	Confined to owner, handler or exhibit not having won a Challenge Certificate/CACIB/CAC/Green Star in the Breed.
<b>POST GRADUATE</b>	For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate/CACIB/CAC/Green Star or five or more First Prizes at Championship Shows in Post Graduate, Minor Limit, Mid Limit, Limit and Open classes, whether restricted or not, at shows where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed.
<b>MID LIMIT</b>	For dogs which have not become show Champions under Kennel Club Regulations or under the rules of any governing body recognised by the Kennel Club or won 3 or more CC/CACIB/CAC/Green Stars or won 5 or more First Prizes in all at Championship Shows in Mid Limit, Limit or Open Classes confined to the breed, whether restricted or not, at shows where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed.
<b>LIMIT</b>	For dogs which have not become show Champions under the Kennel Club Regulations or under the rules of any governing body recognised by the Kennel Club or won 3 or more CC/CACIB/CAC/Green Stars or won 7 or more First Prizes in all at Championship Shows in Limit or Open Classes confined to the Breed, whether restricted or not at Shows where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed.
<b>OPEN</b>	For all dogs of the breed for which the class is provided and eligible for entry at the Show.
<b>VETERAN BRACE</b>	For dogs of not less than seven years of age on the 1 <sup>st</sup> day of the show. For two exhibits (either sex or mixed) of one breed belonging to the same exhibitor, each exhibit having been entered in some class other than Brace or Team.
<b>SPECIAL OPEN HOLDING A WORKING CERTIFICATE NOT FOR COMPETITION</b>	<i>For dogs holding a Working Certificate signed by the Master of a pack recognised by the Master of Foxhounds Association and issued by the Border Terrier Club.</i> Border Terriers and other breeds may be entered Not for Competition. Dogs must be registered with the Kennel Club and be 6 months old on the first day of the show. Details of each dog so entered must be recorded on the entry form, including the breed if not Border Terriers (replacing the wording already printed on the entry form as appropriate).

## SECURITY AT SHOWS

In light of recent events the Kennel Club would like to issue a reminder to all societies of the importance of security at dog shows. The Kennel Club understands that due to the nature of dog shows and the quantity of paraphernalia exhibitors bring, it would be extremely difficult for show organisers to take on the issue of security alone, therefore we would reiterate the advice being given by the Police and Security Services, that everyone in the UK should remain vigilant and this applies to those organising and taking part in dog shows.

The importance of exhibitors feeling that they and their dogs are safe when attending a show cannot be underestimated. We would therefore remind you of the importance of the need for show organisers and exhibitors to remain mindful of potential dangers and that all visitors generally need to be vigilant and alert.

Furthermore the society should provide robust notification informing exhibitors of where to report to should they see anything suspicious or of concern, and of the evacuation procedures in place.

**Should you see anything suspicious or of concern**, please alert the Show Manager, Mr Eddie Houston and/or the Show Secretary, Mrs Kathy Wilkinson immediately. If it is a package or bag you are concerned about, please do NOT attempt to move it or examine it yourself.

**Should it be necessary for the hall to be evacuated**, please remember that evacuation should be carried out as speedily but as safely as possible, as in the case of a fire. It is important that you do not block the exit routes with cages or bags and follow any instructions given to you by the Show Management regarding evacuation procedures.

## EXISTING SAMPLES PREVIOUSLY SUBMITTED TO THE AHT FOR RESEARCH PURPOSES:

The Animal Health Trust has confirmed that, unfortunately, existing swab samples that were previously submitted for research purposes cannot be used for the DNA test for SLEM/SPS. The AHT's DNA Testing Section has very specific sample tracking procedures, using unique barcodes generated when the test is purchased online. So this means that everyone will require to take fresh samples using the swabs which the AHT DNA Testing Section will send out when these are ordered.

The AHT has confirmed they will be pleased if people will continue to send in research swab kits for future research into anything else that the Trust might be involved in. Research swab kits will be available at this show - please see the Secretary.

Glioma (brain tumour)  
Calve-Legge-Perthe Disease (Perthes Disease)
