Some 35+ years ago, my mum and dad (Mary & Ted Whitehill) started in the breed and as a result I grew up around the dog world and Papillons. From an early age I started showing the paps, and by the time I was a teenager I was hooked and used to show the dogs, under my mums Amicae affix, all over the UK. During the time when I was actively showing I handled a number of my mums breeding to their UK Ch titles.

I then decided it was about time I got my own affix and I went for Martika. I went on to add a UK Ch under the Amicae affix, but owned by myself, and of the few litters I bred, 1 UK Ch under the Martika affix.

Unfortunately the real world came calling and university, IT career and having 3 girls have taken top priority and my days of showing and breeding have been on hold for a number of years now.

Thankfully I passed on my handling tips to my mum and she has continued the success without me, indeed showing one of my dogs to Toy Group and RBIS at WELKS ch show.

I have continued to have a Papillons as part of the family and just now we have 2 at home who are spoiled more than me. I'm sure if the girls could get away with it there would be a few more running around the garden

Before the days of breed seminars, I was given advice on all aspects of the breed by some of the top breeders of that time. I was very fortunate in that some very knowledgeable breeders took the time to help me, be that with grooming, trimming & showing as well as understanding pedigrees, breeding lines etc. Looking back, part of my day at the shows was talking to these exhibitors about dogs, breeding programs, lines, type and all round breed knowledge.

I first started judging the breed when I was around 17 and my first Championship show appointment was East of England in 1997. I have since judged the breed at UK Championship shows on a further 8 occasions, with my last appointment being at Crufts, a truly special judging appointment.

I always find it an honour and to judge the breed and I hope you all enjoy today.

REGULATIONS FOR THE PREPARATION OF DOGS FOR EXHIBITION F (B)

- These Regulations must be observed when a dog is prepared for exhibition and/or exhibited at any Kennel Club Licensed event. Objections may be referred to the General Committee for disciplinary action under these Show Regulations and/or for disciplinary action under Kennel Club Rule A11.
 - a) A dog found to have been exhibited in breach of these Regulations will automatically be disqualified from exhibition at the show and from any award gained there at.
 - b) Unless the exhibitor provides a satisfactory explanation for the dog being exhibited in breach of these Regulations then he/she may be subject to further penalties of either a fine or as listed under Rule A11.
- a) No substance which alters the natural colour, texture or body of the coat may be present in the dog's coat for any purpose at any time during the show. No substance which alters the natural colour of any external part of the dog may by present on the dog for any purpose at any time during the show.
 - b) Any other substance (other than water) which may be used in the preparation of a dog for exhibition must not be allowed to remain in the coat or on any other part of the dog at the time of exhibition
- No act or operation which alters the natural conformation of a dog or any part thereof may be performed except:
 - a) Operations certified to the satisfaction of the General Committee.
 - b) The removal of dew claws of any breed.

Operations to prevent breeding provided that such operations are notified to the Kennel Club before neutered dogs are shown.

- Nor must anything be done calculated to in the opinion of the General Committee to deceive.

 4. The General Committee without previous notice may order an examination of any dog or dogs at any Show. Any examination thus ordered will be made by a person having executive authority who shall have a written directive from the Kennel Club in their possession. Samples may be taken for further examination and analysis.
- An individual has the right to lodge an objection to a dog only if he/she is the owner or handler of a dog competing in the same breed or class. An objection may, however, be lodged by an official of the Show or by anyone so deputed by the Kennel Club. It will be the responsibility of the individual who lodges the objection or the official (as appropriate) to substantiate the grounds for the objection. The Kennel Club will substantiate the grounds for an objection made on its behalf.
- Any objection by an individual related to an infringement of these regulations must be made in writing to the Show Secretary at his/her office before the close of the Show & the individual must produce evidence of identity at the time of lodging the complaint.

<u>Soft Crates</u>: The Kennel Club has asked that we draw attention to the potential health and safety implications concerning the use of soft crates as in its view, they do not offer sufficient protection to dogs. They have asked that we point out that dogs should not be left unattended in soft crates. There have been instances where dogs have escaped from soft crates which have not been securely fastened to benches, or that have been left at ringside.

We therefore ask that if you use soft crates, you do not leave the dogs unattended, either in the hall, or in an open car in the car park.

DOGS IN VEHICLES ON HOT DAYS

Your dog is vulnerable and AT RISK if left in a vehicle in high temperatures and even on days considered as slightly warm. Please take care of your dog. If your dog is found to be at risk forcible entry to your vehicle may be necessary without liability for any damage caused.
