JUDGES PROFILE

Mr Doug Johnston (Dourhu)

Dourhu (Doug & Ruth) is a prefix you probably associate with my dear wife Ruth rather than me. Nevertheless, she and I shared the Papillon journey together for most of the last 50 years. In that time, with lots of help in the beginning from Bob & Peggy Russell-Roberts (Picaroon) and other old masters, Ruth and I, by line breeding, produced over 10 British/American/Australian home bred champions and over 25 home bred exhibits with Stud Book entries to their credit.

Whilst doing so we shared all the tasks involved in breeding, whelping, judging the litter, picking the prospects, training and showing them and proving to ourselves, by the results, that we were on the right track. The best result Dourhu (Desperado) can claim credit for was to come 3rd overall out of 8300 dogs entered at Bournemouth Champ Show in 1984. Even some of those we parted with to others proved their breeding by producing winners in the next generation and even today some winning dogs have Dourhu in their background.

I made my judging debut at the North of Scotland Toy Dog Society's first show in Aberdeen in 1973 and at Altrincham in Cheshire in 1977 I judged the Papillon Club's Open Show ahead of the formation of the Northern & Eastern Counties Papillon Club. Since then I have accepted a limited number of other appointments in England and Scotland, preferring to watch Ruth's career rather than my own. flourish.

REGULATIONS FOR THE PREPARATION OF DOGS FOR EXHIBITION F (B)

- 1. These Regulations must be observed when a dog is prepared for exhibition and/or exhibited at any Kennel Club Licensed event. Objections may be referred to the General Committee for disciplinary action under these Show Regulations and/or for disciplinary action under Kennel Club Rule A11.
 - a) A dog found to have been exhibited in breach of these Regulations will automatically be disqualified from exhibition at the show and from any award gained there at.
 - b) Unless the exhibitor provides a satisfactory explanation for the dog being exhibited in breach of these Regulations then he/she may be subject to further penalties of either a fine or as listed under Rule A11.
- 2. a) No substance which alters the natural colour, texture or body of the coat may be present in the dog's coat for any purpose at any time during the show. No substance which alters the natural colour of any external part of the dog may by present on the dog for any purpose at any
 - b) Any other substance (other than water) which may be used in the preparation of a dog for exhibition must not be allowed to remain in the coat or on any other part of the dog at the time of
- 3. No act or operation which alters the natural conformation of a dog or any part thereof may be performed except:
 - a) Operations certified to the satisfaction of the General Committee.b) The removal of dew claws of any breed.

Operations to prevent breeding provided that such operations are notified to the Kennel Club before neutered dogs are shown.

- Nor must anything be done calculated to in the opinion of the General Committee to deceive. The General Committee without previous notice may order an examination of any dog or dogs at any Show. Any examination thus ordered will be made by a person having executive authority who shall have a written directive from the Kennel Club in their possession. Samples may be taken for further examination and analysis.
- 5. An individual has the right to lodge an objection to a dog only if he/she is the owner or handler of a dog competing in the same breed or class. An objection may, however, be lodged by an official of the Show or by anyone so deputed by the Kennel Club. It will be the responsibility of the individual who lodges the objection or the official (as appropriate) to substantiate the grounds for the objection. The Kennel Club will substantiate the grounds for an objection made on its
- 6. Any objection by an individual related to an infringement of these regulations must be made in writing to the Show Secretary at his/her office before the close of the Show & the individual must produce evidence of identity at the time of lodging the complaint.

Soft Crates: The Kennel Club has asked that we draw attention to the potential health and safety implications concerning the use of soft crates as in its view, they do not offer sufficient protection to dogs. They have asked that we point out that dogs should not be left unattended in soft crates. There have been instances where dogs have escaped from soft crates which have not been securely fastened to benches, or that have been left at ringside.

We therefore ask that if you use soft crates, you do not leave the dogs unattended, either in the hall, or in an open car in the car park.

DOGS IN VEHICLES ON HOT DAYS

Your dog is vulnerable and AT RISK if left in a vehicle in high temperatures and even on days considered as slightly warm. Please take care of your dog. If your dog is found to be at risk forcible entry to your vehicle may be necessary without liability for any damage caused.
