- Not for Competition entries will be accepted. Details of each dog so entered must be recorded on the entry form and must be Kennel Club registered. No modifications will be made to this Schedule except by permission of the Board of the Kennel Club, which will be followed by advertisement in the Canine Press wherever possible. All monies including those accrued through Bank Charges are the responsibility of the exhibitor and exhibitors liable for any monies which remain unpaid after the day of the Show will be reported to the Kennel Club. Should a judge be prevented from fulfilling his/her engagement the Committee reserves the right to appoint another in his/her place. Exhibitors are at liberty to withdraw from competition but no entry fees can be 21. refunded.
- 22. A dog may be disqualified by the General Committee from any award, whether an objection has been made or not, if proved amongst other things to have been registered or recorded as having been bred by the scheduled judge. This shall not apply to a Judge appointed in an emergency. No animal other than a dog duly entered at this Show will be allowed within the precincts of the Show during its
- 23. continuance.
- The Show will be unbenched. 24.
- 25. An announcement prior to the date of closing of entries in Our Dogs of any alteration made in the schedule shall be deemed sufficient notice thereof.
- 26. All entries must be made on or before Monday 29th July, 2019 (postmark) upon forms enclosed for that purpose. One dog can be entered in several classes if eligible. Entry fees will not be refunded once an entry has been made.
- 27. If acknowledgement is required, an addressed and stamped postcard with "receipt" written on the reverse should be enclosed for the Secretary's signature.
- Judges will be instructed and empowered to withhold the prize or prizes in any class if, in their opinion, the dog 28. or dogs exhibited do not possess sufficient merit. Judges are not empowered to give prizes beyond those offered in the schedule of prizes.
- Any trophy awarded at this Show shall be confined to members of the North of England Hunt, Point Retrieve 29. Club.
- 30. The Committee is empowered to exclude or remove any dog which in the opinion of a Veterinary Surgeon of the Show is not in a fit state for exhibition owing to disease, vice or any other cause.
- 31. Gangways must be kept clear at all times.
- 32. Should any guestion arises not provided for in these Regulations, the decision of the Committee shall be final. subject to appeal to the Kennel Club.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

- The Show will open at 10.00 a.m.
- 2. Dogs will be received at any time but it is the exhibitors responsibility to ensure that exhibits are available for judging when required.
- Judging will commence at 11.00 a.m. 3. 4.
- Exhibits may be removed from the Show after their judging has been completed. The Show will close half an
- hour after all judging has been completed by which time dogs must be removed. Entry Fees: Members £5.50 for first entry with each dog. Non-Members £6.00 for first entry with each dog; all subsequent entries with same dog £1.00, Junior Handling £1.00 per handler per class. Not for Competition £1.00 5. per dog.
- 6. There is no prize money on offer at this show (excluding Special Members Stakes 1st - £5.00, 2nd - £3.00 - 3rd -£2.00 and Breed Supported Entries)

- £2.00 and Breed Supported Entries) The Committee reserved to itself the right to refuse entries. Puppies under six calendar months of age on the first day of the Show are not eligible for exhibition. The mating of bitches within the precincts of the Show is forbidden. Where a Best Puppy in Show competition is scheduled the Best Puppy in Show is a puppy which has competed and has been declared Best Puppy in Breed, (Best Any Variety Not Separately Classified Puppy or Best Any Variety Imported Breed Register Puppy). A puppy is a dog of six and not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the first day of the Show. Where the Best of Breed or Best in Show is a puppy it should automatically be awarded Best Puppy in Breed and Best Puppy in Show respectively. Where the Reserve Best of Breed or Reserve Best in Show is a puppy which has only been beaten by an adult dog it should also automatically be Best Puppy in Breed and Best Puppy in Show respectively. Consequently, selection of Best Puppy in Breed and Best Puppy in Show must follow the selection of Best of Breed and Best in Show respectively. The dog declared Best in Show must be selected from Best of Breed, (Best Any Variety Not Separately Classified Puppy or Best Any Variety Imported Breed Register Puppy). Reserve Best in Show must be selected from the remaining Best of Breed(s) and the dog/bitch declared by the breed judge to be Reserve Best of Breed to the dog declared Best in Show. 10
- 11 declared Best in Show.
- 12 Exhibits will not be admitted to Best in Show competition after a period of ten minutes has elapsed since the announcement that exhibits are required for judging, unless they have been unavoidably delayed by the previous judging not being completed on time, and then only with the special permission of the Show Management.
- Exhibitors must not pick up dogs by their tails and leads when lifting them nor handle a dog in a manner which 13. causes its feet not to touch the ground when on the move. This is not acceptable. Exhibitors should note that such practice would constitute harsh handling and reports of such practice will be referred to the Kennel Club Show Regulation F11.
- All exhibitors must be familiar with Kennel Club Regulations F (Annex B) Regulations for the Preparation of 14. Dogs for Exhibition.
- All dogs resident outside the UK must be issued with a Kennel Club Authority to compete number before entry 15. to the show/event can be made. All overseas entries without an Authority to compete number will be returned to the exhibitor/competitor.
- DOGS IN VEHICLES ON HOT DAYS. Anyone whose dog is entered at a Kennel Club licensed event should 16 DOGS IN VEHICLES ON HOT DAYS. Anyone whose dog is entered at a Kennel Club licensed event should take all reasonable steps to ensure the needs of their dog(s) are met, and should not put a dog's health and welfare at risk by any action, default, omission or otherwise. Breach of Kennel Club Regulations in this respect may be referred to the General Committee for disciplinary action under Kennel Club Rules and Regulations. Your dog is vulnerable and at risk during hot weather and the Kennel Club offers the following guidance to help guide you through the do's and don'ts travelling to and whilst at KC licenced events.
 When travelling to a show please take a moment to consider whether the route to the show is on a busy boliday route, and leave earlier to avoid increased time in traffic iams.

 - holiday route, and leave earlier to avoid increased time in traffic jams.
 - If your vehicle is not air-conditioned seriously consider whether travelling to the show is a good idea at all.
 - The vehicle should be as fully ventilated as possible, and plenty of stops should be taken, with lots of water available to drink.
 - Ensure your dog is not sitting in full sunlight. There should be plenty of free flowing air around the dog.
 - When at the show, never leave your dog in the vehicle.
 - Keep the dog in the shade take your own shade for example a large umbrella and always have plenty of water available to drink so your dog stays well hydrated.
 - Avoid your dog taking part in unnecessary exertion, or from standing in exposed sunlight for extended lengths of time.

Remember, if you feel hot your dog is very likely to feel much hotter and dehydrated, and this could lead to dire

results. DEFINITIONS OF CLASSES

In the following definitions, a Challenge Certificate included any Show award that counts towards the title of Champion under the Rules of any governing body recognised by the Kennel Club.

In the case of a dog owned in partnership and entered in Members' classes or competing for Member's Specials each partner must at the time of entry be a member of the society.

In estimating the number of awards won, all wins up to and including the seventh day before the first closing date shall be counted when entering for any class i.e.: **Saturday 5th August, 2023.**

Wins in Variety classes do not count for entry in Breed classes but when entering for Variety classes wins in both Breed and Variety classes must be counted. First prizes awarded in any classes defined as Special do not count towards eligibility.

If an exhibitor reports before judging of a class that a dog has been entered which is ineligible, the exhibitor may choose one of the following options:-

1) Withdrawal - The dog may be withdrawn from competition subject to the conditions of Regulation F.(1).19.

2) Transfer - a) If a dog is ineligible for a class or classes as regards its colour, sex, weight or height the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the equivalent class or classes for the correct colour, sex, weight or height and, in the event of there being no equivalent class, Minor Puppy and Puppy excepted to the Open class for the correct colour, sex, weight or height.

b) If an exhibit is entered incorrectly in a Minor Puppy Class, Puppy Class or Junior Class, which is over age but under 12 calendar months of age, 18 calendar months of age or 24 calendar months of age retrospectively the show secretary shall transfer the exhibit to the Puppy Class, Junior Class, or Yearling Class retrospectively for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight or height and in the event of there being no Puppy, Junior or Yearling Class to the Open Class for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight or height.

c) For any reason other that the above, the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the Open class for the correct colour, sex, weight or height.

d) If an exhibit arrives late and misses a class, even if it is the only call in which the dog is entered, the dog may not be transferred to any other class.

PUPPY JUNIOR	For dogs of six and not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the first day of the Show. For dogs of six and not exceeding eighteen calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.
SPECIAL YEARLING	For dogs of six and not exceeding twenty four calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.
GRADUATE	For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate/CACIB/CAC/Green Star or four or more First Prizes at Championship Shows in Graduate, Post Graduate, Minor Limit, Mid Limit, and Open Classes, whether restricted or nor where Challenge Certificated were offered for the breed
POST GRADUATE	For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate/CACIB/CAC/Green Star or five or more First Prizes at Championship Shows in Post Graduate, Minor Limit, Mid Limit, Limit and Open
LIMIT	classes, whether restricted or not where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed. For dogs which have not become show Champions under the Kennel Club Regulations or under the rules of any governing body recognised by the Kennel Club, or won 3 or more CACIB/CAC/Green Stars, or won five or more First Prizes in all at Championship Shows in Mid Limit, Limit or Open Classes confined to the breed, whether restricted or not, at shows where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed.
OPEN	For all dogs of the breeds for which the class is provided and eligible for entry at the Show.
VETERAN	For dogs of not less than seven years of age on the first day of the Show.
FIELD TRIAL	For dogs which have an award, Diploma of Merit or Certificate of Merit in actual competition at a Field Trial held under Kennel Club or Irish Kennel Club Field Trial Regulations.
CHAMPION	For dogs which have been confirmed a Champion, show Champion or Field Trial Champion.
	Champion classes may not be scheduled for individual breeds or varieties of breeds.
IMPORTED BREED	For breeds confined to the Imported Breeds Register and only when an Interim
REGISTER	Breed Standard has been published by the Kennel Club. Such breeds may be exhibited in this class only, with the winning dog being eligible for Best in Group / Best Puppy in Group or Best in Show / Best Puppy in Show as relevant.
NOT FOR COMPETITION Not for Competition entries will be accepted at £1.00 per dog. Details of each dog so entered	
	must be recorded on the entry form and must be Kennel Club Registered. Dogs aged four calendar months and over are eligible to enter Not for Competition at Single and Sub Group

shows (Only breeds included in the schedule.)
