## IMPORTANT NOTICES

Dog Fouling: All exhibitors are required to clear up any fouling by their dog(s). Any violation of this regulation will be reported to the Show Manager, who will take any action as seen necessary. Venues for dog shows are becoming more difficult to find, so we need to ensure that we keep this venue clean - please help us to achieve this. Plastic Bags will be available at the Secretary's table if you forget your own.

Children: Parents/Guardians will be held responsible for the behaviour and actions of any children in their care at all times while in the precincts of the Show.

Dogs in Cars: Remedial action, in accordance with the Kennel Club guidelines will be taken in the event of any dog found to be in a distress state. (See Rules \& Regulations - No 16)

Please Note: The Show Management reserve the right to alter and amend the Order of Judging and the Ring Number to ensure the smooth running of the Show.

Cages: Can we remind exhibitors that in accordance with Kennel Club Rules cages are not permitted around the ringside.

## THE BACK ENTRANCE TO THE VENUE WILL NOT BE USED. IT IS ONLY TO BE USED IN CASE OF EMERGENCY

Fire: It is extremely important that we keep all gangways and exits from the rings clear to allow for easy access in the event of an emergency. There are also clearly marked fire exits at this venue which we have a duty to ensure are kept free at all times. Exhibitors will be asked to move if the committee feel they are in any way restricting access to these exits.

Prize Money: Paid in cash to the winners of the relevant classes where prize money is offered (as stated on the front of the schedule).

Stakes Classes: Entry fee is $£ 4.50$ per dog. Entry fee non-refundable if for any reason you have to withdraw from any entered class. Timing of the Stakes classes cannot be guaranteed and any delay of breed/group judging to facilitate exhibitors entered in the Stakes classes will be at the discretion of the judge and the show management.

Any Variety Not Separately Classified: Dogs (and Puppies) are NOT ELIGIBLE for entry in Any Variety Not Separately Classified classes if there are ANY classes scheduled for the breed. If there is no Puppy classes in your scheduled breed you can enter in any breed class, the puppy will then be eligible to compete for Best Puppy in Breed if they are unbeaten by another puppy in the breed. Alternatively puppies with breed classes but no puppy breed classes may be entered in AV Puppy. Dogs/Puppies of breeds not scheduled at this show can enter the AVNSC Dog/Puppy in their group and, if unbeaten by another dog/puppy as relevant can compete for Best AVNSC Dog/Puppy in their group as relevant.

Dogs eligible to compete for Best in Groups: ONLY unbeaten dogs declared Best of Breed or Best AVNSC in their groups are eligible to compete for Best in Group.

Veteran Class Exhibits: Dogs entered in AV veteran classes are NOT ELIGIBLE to compete in their Group unless unbeaten and declared Best of Breed or Best AVNSC in their group. There is a competition for Best Veteran in Show following BIS \& BPIS.

Soft Crates: The Kennel Club has drawn attention to the potential health \& safety implications concerning the use of soft crates at shows and in it's view, they do not offer sufficient protection to dogs. Soft crates left unattended at the ringside are a potential hazard particularly when occupied by large breeds, and it has been known for dogs to become distressed and move soft crates along the floor and also escape. Soft crates should only be used when there is sufficient room available and when they can be safely secured.

Groups being judged Outside - Please note for Groups Judging in outside Rings NO WET WEATHER RINGS will be available on the day.

In the following definitions, a Challenge Certificate includes any Show award that counts towards the title of Champion under the Rules of any governing body recognised by the Kennel Club.
Wins at Championship Shows in breed classes where Challenge Certificates are not on offer shall be counted as wins at Open Shows.
In the case of a dog owned in partnership and entered in Members' classes or competing for Members' Specials each partner must at the time of entry be a member of the Society.
In estimating the number of awards won, all wins up to and including the seventh day before the first closing date shall be counted when entering for any class i.e.: Saturday $8^{\text {th }}$ July, 2023.
Wins in Variety classes do not count for entry in Breed classes but when entering for Variety classes, wins in both Breed and Variety classes must be counted. First prizes awarded in any classes defined as Special do not count towards eligibility.
If an exhibitor reports before the judging of a class or classes that a dog has been entered which is ineligible, the exhibitor may choose one of the following options:-
(1) WITHDRAWAL: The dog may be withdrawn from competition subject to the conditions of Regulation F . (1). 19.
(2) TRANSFER: a) If a dog is ineligible for a class or classes as regards its breed, colour, sex, weight or height the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the equivalent class or classes for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight or height and, in the event of there being no equivalent class, Minor Puppy and Puppy excepted to the Open class for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight or height.
b) If an exhibit is entered incorrectly in a Minor Puppy Class, Puppy Class or Junior Class, which is over age but under 12 calendar months of age, 18 calendar months of age or 24 calendar months of age respectively the show secretary shall transfer the exhibit to the Puppy Class, Junior Class, or Yearling Class respectively for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight or height and in the event of there being no Puppy, Junior or Yearling Class to the Open Class for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight or height.
c) For any reason other than the above, the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the Open class for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight or height.
d) If an exhibit arrives late and misses a class, even if it is the only class in which the dog is entered, the dog may not be transferred to any other class.

For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate/CACIB/CAC/Green Star or five or more First Prizes at Championship Shows in Post Graduate, Minor Limit, Mid Limit, Limit and Open classes, whether restricted or not where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed.

For dogs which have not become show Champions under the Kennel Club Regulations or under the rules of any governing body recognised by the Kennel Club or won 3 or more CACIB/CAC/Green Stars or won 7 or more First Prizes in all at Championship Shows in Limit or Open Classes confined to the Breed, whether restricted or not at Shows where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed.

For all dogs of the breeds for which the class is provided and eligible for entry at the Show.

For all dogs of not less than seven years of age on the day of the Show.
For all dogs aged 10 years of age or more on the day of Show.
For breeds of dog for which no separate breed classes are scheduled.
For breeds confined to the Imported Breeds Register and only when an
Interim Breed Standard has been published by the Kennel Club. Such breeds may be exhibited in this class only, with the winning dog being eligible for Best in Group/Best Puppy in Group or Best in Show/Best Puppy in Show as relevant.

JUNIOR/ADULT HANDLING Classes will be judged in handling, open to all dogs; the entry being restricted by the age of the handler in each class.
NOT FOR COMPETITION Societies may at the discretion, accept Not for Competition entries. Societies may accept such entries from breeds of dogs not included within the title of the Society and at Shows held over more than one day, such entries may be accepted on any day from any breed.

## RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. The Show will open at 8.15 a.m.
2. Dogs will be received until 12 noon after which no dogs may be received except under exceptional and unforeseen circumstances any by special permission of the Show Management.
3. Judging will commence at 9.00 a.m.
4. Exhibits may be removed from the Show after their judging has been completed. The Show will close half an hour after all judging has been completed.
5. ENTRY FEES: Members $£ 4.80$ First Entry per Dog, $£ 1.50$ p subsequent entries for SAME DOG. Non Members $£ 5.80$ First Entry per Dog, $£ 2.00$ subsequent entries for SAME DOG. Handling Classes $£ 2.00$ per class. Not for Competition $£ 1.00$ per dog. Catalogues $£ 3.00$ pre-paid with entries only (must be collected by 12.00 noon) Advertisements Full page $£ 10.00$; Half page $£ 5.00$. Membership Fees: Joint $£ 3.00$, Single $£ 2.00$ (due $1^{\text {st }}$ January Annually)
6. PRIZE MONEY: Please see classification for details of Prize Money on offer at this show.
7. The Committee reserves to itself the right to refuse entries.
8. Puppies under six calendar months of age on the first day of the Show are not eligible for exhibition.
9. The mating of bitches within the precincts of the Show is forbidden.
10. BEST PUPPY IN SHOW: Where a Best Puppy in Show competition is scheduled the Best Puppy in Show is a puppy which has competed and has been declared Best Puppy in Breed, Best Any Variety Not Separately Classified Puppy or Best Any Variety Imported Breed Register Puppy. A Puppy is a dog of six and not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the first day of the Show. Where the Best of Breed, Best in Group or Best in Show is a Puppy may, at the discretion of the judge, be awarded Best Puppy in Breed, Best Puppy in Group and Best Puppy in Show respectively. Where if the Reserve Best of Breed, Reserve Best of Group or Reserve Best in Show is a Puppy which has only been beaten by an adult dog it may, at the discretion of the judge, be Best Puppy in Breed, Best Puppy in Group and Best Puppy in Show respectively. Consequently, selection of Best Puppy in Breed, Best Puppy in Group \& Best Puppy in Show must follow the selection of Best of Breed, Best of Group \& Best in Show respectively.
Best Puppy in Group and subsequent Puppy Group placings must be selected from:
a) Those puppies declared Best Puppy in Breed.
b) The puppy declared Best Puppy from the Any Variety Not Separately Classified classes in each group or on each day.
c) The puppy declared Best Puppy from the any Variety Imported Breed Register classes in each group or on each day.
11. BEST IN SHOW: The dog declared Best in Show is a dog which has competed and has been declared Best of Breed, Best Any Variety Not Separately Classified or Best Any Variety Imported Breed Register.
a) Shows Judged On The Group System: (Definition; Shows judged on the Group System includes classes for breeds within more than one Group, as defined in the Kennel Club Regulations $B(A)$; and require a judge to declare a best of each group after which the exhibits so declared will compete for the award of Best in Show and Reserve Best in Show).
1) Best of Breed: Where a breed is separately classified a Best of Breed may be declared but only from those dogs which have received a first prize in a breed class at the show. Where separate classes are provided for each sex of a breed a Best of each Sex must be declared.
2) Best of Group Best of Group and subsequent placings must be selected from:-
a) The Best of Breed winners in each Group.
b) The best dog from the Any Variety not Separately Classified classes in each Group or on each day.
c) The Best dog from Any Variety Imported Breed Register classes in each Group or on each day.
3) Best in Show: Best in Show must be selected from the Best of Group winners. Reserve Best in Show must be selected from the remaining Group winners following the selection for Best in Show.
12. Exhibits will not be admitted to Best in Show competition after a period of ten minutes has elapsed since the announcement that exhibits are required for judging, unless they have been unavoidably been delayed by previous judging not being completed on time, and then only with a special permission of the Show Management.
13. Exhibitors must not pick up dogs by their tails and leads when lifting them nor handle a dog in a manner which causes its feet not to touch the ground when on the move. This is not acceptable. Exhibitors should note that such practice would constitute harsh handling and reports of such practice will be referred to the Committee under Kennel Club Show Regulation F11.
14. All exhibitors must be familiar with Kennel Club Regulation F (Annex B) Regulations for the Preparation of Dogs for Exhibition.
15. All dogs resident outside the UK must be issued with a Kennel Club Authority to Compete number before entry to the show/event can be made. All overseas entries without an Authority to Compete number will be returned to the exhibitor/competitor
16. DOGS IN VEHICLES ON HOT DAYS. Anyone whose dog is entered at a Kennel Club licensed event should take all reasonable steps to ensure the needs of their dog(s) are met, and should not put a dog's health and welfare at risk by any action, default, omission or otherwise. Breach of Kennel Club Regulations in this respect may be referred to the General Committee for disciplinary action under Kennel Club Rules and Regulations. Your dog is vulnerable and at risk during hot weather and the Kennel Club offers the following guidance to help guide you through the do's and don'ts travelling to and whilst at KC licenced events.
When travelling to a show please take a moment to consider whether the route to the show is on a busy holiday route, and leave earlier to avoid increased time in traffic jams.

- If your vehicle is not air-conditioned seriously consider whether travelling to the show is a good idea at all.
- The vehicle should be as fully ventilated as possible, and plenty of stops should be taken, with lots of water available to drink.
- Ensure your dog is not sitting in full sunlight. There should be plenty of free flowing air around the dog.
- When at the show, never leave your dog in the vehicle.
- Keep the dog in the shade - take your own shade for example a large umbrella and always have plenty of water available to drink so your dog stays well hydrated.
- Avoid your dog taking part in unnecessary exertion, or from standing in exposed sunlight for extended lengths of time.
Remember, if you feel hot your dog is very likely to feel much hotter and dehydrated, and this could lead to dire results. Please look after your dog's welfare.


## WARNING: IF YOUR DOG IS FOUND TO BE AT RISK FORCIBLE ENTRY TO YOUR VEHICLE MAY BE NECESSARY WITHOUT LIABILITY FOR ANY DAMAGE CAUSED.

17. Anyone whose dog is entered at a Kennel Club licensed event should take all reasonable steps to ensure the needs of their dog(s) are met, and should not put a dog's health and welfare at risk by any action, default, omission or otherwise. Breach of Kennel Club Regulations in this respect may be referred to the Board for disciplinary action under Kennel Club Rules and Regulations. The use of pinch collars, electronic shock collars, or prong collars, is not permitted at any show licensed by the Kennel Club. This shall apply at the venue or within the precincts of the show.
18. Not for competition entries will be accepted. Details of each dog so entered must be recorded on the entry form and must be Kennel Club registered.
19. No modifications will be made to the schedule except by permission of the Board of the Kennel Club, which will be followed by advertisement in the Canine press wherever possible.
20. Exhibitors/handlers are responsible for the cleaning up and removing of any loose hair or fouling from dogs in their charge, or any litter whether from the car park, exercise area or any other part of the venue.
21. The show will be held under Kennel Club Ltd. Rules and Regulations. Each exhibitor making an entry or entries at this show shall be deemed to have agreed to abide by these rules and regulations and it is on this understanding only that entry's are received.
22. Parents/Guardians please note, well behaved children are welcome. But those in charge of children will be held fully responsible for their actions any damaged caused within the environs of the show.
23. Owners, handlers, exhibitors or any other person in charge of a dog at a Kennel Club licensed event must ensure at all times that the dog is kept under proper control whilst at the licensed venue including environs, car parks and approaches.
24. A dog may be disqualified by the Board from any award, whether an objection has been lodged or not, if proven amongst other things to have been registered or recorded to have been as having been bred by the scheduled judge. This shall not apply to a judge appointed in an emergency.
25. Bank charges incurred through incorrectly completed or dishonoured cheques will be passed onto the exhibitor concerned. Any exhibitor failing to pay entry fees and/or bank charges will be dealt with by the committee of the Kennel Club. Cheques been dishonoured will incur an additional charge of £10.
26. No passes will be posted. Please enclose a SAE or SA post card with your entries if acknowledgement of entries is required.
27. The owner, exhibitor, handler or any other person in charge of dog at a Kennel Club licensed event must at all times ensure that the dog is kept under proper control whilst at the licensed venue including its environs, caravans, car parks and approaches. This regulation applies before (at any time during the set up period at the venue), during the event and afterwards (at any time during the breakdown of the event).

## REGULATIONS FOR THE PREPARATION OF DOGS FOR EXHIBITION F (B)

1. These Regulations must be observed when a dog is prepared for exhibition and/or exhibited at any Kennel Club Licensed event. Objections may be referred to the Board for disciplinary action under these Show Regulations and/or for disciplinary action under Kennel Club Rule A11.
a) A dog found to have been exhibited in breach of these Regulations will automatically be disqualified from exhibition at the show and from any award gained thereat.
b) Unless the exhibitor provides a satisfactory explanation for the dog being exhibited in breach of these Regulations then he/she may be subject to further penalties of either a fine or as listed under Rule A11.
2. a) No substance which alters the natural colour, texture or body of the coat may be present in the dog's coat for any purpose at any time during the show. No substance which alters the natural colour of any external part of the dog may by present on the dog for any purpose at any time during the show.
b) Any other substance (other than water) which may be used in the preparation of a dog for exhibition must not be allowed to remain in the coat or on any other part of the dog at the time of exhibition.
3. No act or operation which alters the natural conformation of a dog or any part thereof may be performed except:-
a) Operations certified to the satisfaction of the Board.
b) The removal of dew claws of any breed.
c) Operations to prevent breeding provided that such operations are notified to the Kennel Club before neutered dogs are shown.
. Nor must anything be done calculated to in the opinion of the Board to deceive.
The Board without previous notice may order an examination of any dog or dogs at any Show. Any examination thus ordered will be made by a person having executive authority who shall have a written directive from the Kennel Club in their possession. Samples may be taken for further examination and analysis.
4. An individual has the right to lodge an objection to a dog only if he/she is the owner or handler of a dog competing in the same breed or class. An objection may, however, be lodged by an official of the Show or by anyone so deputed by the Kennel Club. It will be the responsibility of the individual who lodges the objection or the official (as appropriate) to substantiate the grounds for the objection. The Kennel Club will substantiate the grounds for an objection made on its behalf.
5. Any objection by an individual related to an infringement of these regulations must be made in writing to the Show Secretary at his/her office before the close of the Show \& the individual must produce evidence of identity at the time of lodging the complaint.

## DIRECTIONS TO THE VENUE

From M5 North: Exit Junction 30. Take 3rd exit at the roundabout onto A379 Exeter/ March Barton for 3 miles. At 3rd roundabout take last exit onto B3123 March Barton/ Bad Homburg Way. Exit 1st left at next roundabout and the Livestock Centre is 200 metres on the left.

From A38 Plymouth: Exit at A379 for 1.7 miles. Take 2nd exit at the roundabout onto B3123 Bad Homburg Way. Exit 1st left at next roundabout and the Livestock Centre is 200 metres of left.

From A30 Cornwall: Exit A377 Exeter. Follow City A377 through first road junction. Turn right, signposted Marsh Barton, and follow signs to Livestock Centre.
