

IMPORTANT INFORMATION FOR ALL DOG SHOW EXHIBITORS

The Board of the Kennel Club has approved a recommendation which requires exhibitors to display the exhibit/bench number on their crate, cage or container at all times. This is particularly important when cages etc. are not on benches, and at unbenched shows. Each exhibitor is responsible for providing their own crate or cage identification and should note that the original exhibit/bench number card, as provided by the show society, must not be used for this purpose.

DOGS IN VEHICLES ON HOT DAYS

Your dog is vulnerable and AT RISK if left in a vehicle in high temperatures and even on days considered as slightly warm. Please take care of your dog. If your dog is found to be at risk forcible entry to your vehicle may be necessary without liability for any damage caused.

- Not for Competition entries will be accepted. Details of each dog so entered must be recorded on the entry form and must be Kennel Club registered.
- No modifications will be made to this schedule except by permission of the Board of the Kennel Club, which will be followed by advertisement in the Canine Press wherever possible.
- 20. Only undocked and legally docked dogs may be entered for exhibition at this show.
- The Show will be held under Kennel Club Rules and Show regulations. Every exhibitor making an entry or entries at this show shall be deemed to have agreed to abide by these Rules and Regulations and it is on this understanding only that entries are received
- 22. Should a judge being prevented from fulfilling his or hers engagement, the Committee reserve the right to appoint another in his or hers place. Exhibitors may withdraw from competition but no fees will be returned.
- 23. The committee of Show Manager will be empowered to exclude any dog which it not in a fit state for exhibition from disease, vice or any cause whatsoever, and to cause its removal should any symptoms exhibit themselves during the
- 24. Any owner, exhibitor or handler or other person in charge of a dog is required to remove immediately any fowling caused by their dog(s) and/or any grooming waste at any Kennel Club Licensed Show within the licensed venue and within the environs of that event including car and caravan parks and approaches.
- 25. The owner, exhibitor or handler or other person in charge of a dog at Kennel Club Licensed Events must at all times ensure that the dog is kept under proper control whilst at the Licensed venue and within the environs of that event including car and caravan parks and approaches.
- A dog may be disqualified by the Board from any award, whether an objection has been lodged or not, if proved 26 amongst other thing to have been registered and recorded as having been bred by the scheduled judge. This shall not apply to a judged appointed in an emergency.
- Every Exhibitor shall ensure that whilst the dog is being exhibited, its handler shall display the correct ring number. 27.

The Officers & Committee of the Sovereign Pekingese Association do not accept responsibility for any products advertised or sold by stall holders and/or trade stands for the preparation and grooming of dogs which ay not meet the requirements for the Regulations for the Preparation of Dogs for Exhibition.

No responsibility will be held by the Committee or Agents for the loss to exhibitors or their property, and it is on this understanding only that entries are received.

Soft Crates: The Kennel Club has asked that we draw attention to the potential health and safety implications concerning the use of soft crates as in its view, they do not offer sufficient protection to dogs. They have asked that we point out that dogs should not be left unattended in soft crates. There have been instances where dogs have escaped from soft crates which have not been securely fastened to benches, or that have been left at ringside.

We therefore ask that if you use soft crates, you do not leave the dogs unattended, either in the hall, or in an open car in the car park.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

- 1. The show will open at 9.00 a.m.
- Dogs will be received at any time but it is the exhibitor's responsibility to ensure that dogs are available for judging when required.
- 3. Judging will commence at 10.00 a.m.
- Exhibits may be removed from the Show after their judging has been completed. The Show will close half an hour after all judging has been completed.
- 5. ENTRY FEES: Members 1st Entry £10.00, £50 for 5 or more dogs, subsequent entries with same dog £2.00, Non -members 1st Entry £12.00, subsequent entries with same dog £2.00. Not for Competition £2.00 per dog (including puppies 4 months and over) Catalogues £3.00 (pre-paid only), Membership Fees:- £16.00 Single; £18.00 Joint:
- 6. Prize Money is on offer where donated as mentioned in the schedule.
- 7. The Committee reserves to itself the right to refuse entries.
- 8. Puppies under six calendar months of age on the first day of the show are not eligible for exhibition.
- 9. The mating of bitches within the precincts of the show is forbidden.
- 10. Best Puppy in Show Where a Best puppy in Show competition is scheduled the Best Puppy in Show is a puppy which has competed and is unbeaten by any other puppy exhibited at the same Show. A Puppy is a dog of six and not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the first day of the Show. Where the Best in Show is a puppy it may, at the discretion of the judge be awarded Best Puppy in Show. Where the Reserve Best in Show is a puppy which has only been beaten by an adult dog it may, at the discretion of the judge be Best Puppy in Show. Consequently, selection of Best Puppy in Show must follow the selection of Best in Show.
- 11. Best in Show Best in Show must be selected from the exhibits declared Best of Sex. If a Reserve Best in Show is to be selected, the eligible dogs are those declared Best Opposite Sex and Reserve Best of Sex to the exhibit declared Best in Show.
- 12. Exhibits will not be admitted to Best in Show competition after a period of ten minutes has elapsed since the announcement that exhibits are required for judging, unless they have been unavoidably delayed by previous judging not being completed on time, and then only with permission of the Show Management.
- 13. Exhibitors must not pick up dogs by their tails and leads when lifting them nor handle a dog in a manner which causes its feet not touch the ground when on the move. This is not acceptable. Exhibitors should note that such practice would constitute harsh handling and reports of such practice will be referred to the Committee under Kennel Club Show Regulation F11.
- All exhibitors must be familiar with Kennel Club Regulation F (Annex B) Regulations for the Preparation of Dogs for Exhibition.
- 15. All dogs resident outside the UK must be issued with a Kennel Club Authority to Compete number before entry to the show/event can be made. All overseas entries without an Authority to Compete number will be returned to the exhibitor/competitor.
- 16. DOGS IN CARS ON HOT DAYS. Your dog is vulnerable and at risk during hot weather and the Kennel Club offers the following guidance to help guide you through the do's and don'ts travelling to and whilst at KC licenced events.

When travelling to a show please take a moment to consider whether the route to the show is on a busy holiday route, and leave earlier to avoid increased time in traffic jams.

If your vehicle is not air-conditioned seriously consider whether travelling to the show is a good idea at all. The vehicle should be as fully ventilated as possible, and plenty of stops should be taken, with lots of water available to drink.

Ensure your dog is not sitting in full sunlight. There should be plenty of free flowing air around the dog. When at the show, never leave your dog in the vehicle.

Keep the dog in the shade – take your own shade for example a large umbrella and always have plenty of water available to drink so your dog stays well hydrated.

Avoid your dog taking part in unnecessary exertion, or from standing in exposed sunlight for extended lengths of time. Remember, if you feel hot your dog is very likely to feel much hotter and dehydrated, and this could lead to dire results. Please look after your dog's welfare.

17. Anyone whose dog is entered at a Kennel Club licensed event should take all reasonable steps to ensure the needs of their dog(s) are met, and should not put a dog's health and welfare at risk by any action, default, omission or otherwise. Breach of Kennel Club Regulations in this respect may be referred to the Board for disciplinary action under Kennel Club Rules and Regulations. The use of pinch collars, electronic shock collars, or prong collars, is not

JUDGES PROFILE

Bill Delucchi has been around the world of pedigree dogs for over 60 years, during which time he has been associated with some of the finest examples of Miniature Poodles and Pekingese, but let us not forget his association with various other breeds including Afghans, Chows, Shih-Tzus, Lhasa Apsos and Boxers.

From the early 1960s, Bill was a well known character, particularly in the Crewe and Staffordshire areas. These were the days of sanction, limited and open shows, and there are some that can recall Bill exhibiting at these events. Bill's talents were quickly recognised, and were put to good use by various kennels of the day. He was gifted with a natural ability for presenting and handling dogs.

Bill became a successful breeder of Miniature Poodles, producing a number of champions including the famous Ch. Wybun Sea Shell in 1965. Bill worked closely with the Poodle greats, particularly Mrs Conn of the famous Montmartre Kennel, and Mrs Rita Gee of the Beritas Kennel. It is interesting to note that the famous Poodle kennels of today were just starting to establish themselves during this period, and went on to experience colossal success.

It was in 1966 that Bill Hindley Taylor of the world famous Kyratown Kennel was to provide an opening for Bill Delucchi to handle some of the famous Kyratown champions of the day. Can you imagine the thrill of being given the opportunity of actually presenting and handling the finest examples of the breed at that time, particularly taking into consideration that Bill was only in his early to mid twenties? One of the highlights of his career must have been showing Ch. Althaea Dinah of Kyratown at Peterborough Championship Show 1966, and piloting Ch. Dinah to win the CC and BOB under the breed authority, Miss L.M. Mould, and then going on to win the Toy Group and Reserve Best In Show under one of the most famous all rounders of the day, Mr Fred Cross. Regretfully, Bill Hindley Taylor died in November 1971, but by this time Bill Delucchi was well and truly established in the world of dogs, and opportunities were to be made available to him. Jean Eisenman of the famous Jamestown Kennel had returned from a sabbatical in Australia, and had purchased Yu Yang of Jamestown back from Hilda Copley (Sancliffe). Jean entrusted Bill with the future of Yu Yang and he made the most of this dog, presenting and handling him to perfection. This resulted in Yu Yang winning his first CC and BOB under Mr Jack Mitchell (Micklee) at Bournemouth in 1968. Ch. Yu Yang went on to become a pillar of the breed, siring many famous champions.

It was at the Birmingham Pekingese Association in 1982 that Bill was to make his debut as a championship show judge of Pekingese. On that day Bill's co-judge was Mrs Di Holman (Etive). Bill awarded a first CC to Hidden Talent of Toydom, owned by a comparative newcomer to the breed, Mrs Pam Hunter. Di Holman was in complete agreement that the dog should go Best In Show. Ch. Hidden Talent was to go on and win 6 CCs.

DEFINITIONS OF CLASSES

In the following definitions, a Challenge Certificate includes any Show award that counts towards the title of Champion under the Rules of any governing body recognised by the Kennel Club. Show awards issued by the Irish Kennel Club which count towards the title of Champion, shall be five point Green Stars or more. Wins at Championship Shows in breed classes where Challenge Certificates are not on offer shall be counted as wins at Open Shows.

In the case of a dog owned in partnership and entered in Members' classes or competing for Members' Specials each partner must at the time of entry be a member of the Society.

In estimating the number of awards won, all wins up to and including the seventh day before the first closing date shall be counted when entering for any class i.e.: **Friday 12th May, 2023.** Wins in Variety classes do not count for entry in Breed classes but when entering for Variety classes, wins in both Breed and Variety classes must be counted. First prizes awarded in any classes defined as Special do not count towards eligibility.

If an exhibitor reports before the judging of a class or classes that a dog has been entered which is ineligible, the exhibitor may choose one of the following options:-

- (1) **WITHDRAWAL:** The dog may be withdrawn from competition subject to the conditions of Regulation F.(1).19
- (2) **TRANSFÈR**: a) If a dog is ineligible for a class or classes as regards its colour, sex, weight or height the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the equivalent class or classes for the correct colour, sex, weight or height and, in the event of there being no equivalent class, Minor Puppy and Puppy excepted to the Open class for the correct colour, sex, weight or height.
- b) If an exhibit is entered incorrectly in a Minor Puppy Class, Puppy Class or Junior Class, which is over age but under 12 calendar months of age, 18 calendar months of age or 24 calendar months of age respectively the show secretary shall transfer the exhibit to the Puppy Class, Junior Class, or Yearling Class respectively for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight or height and in the event of there being no Puppy, Junior or Yearling Class to the Open Class for the correct colour, sex, weight or height.
- c) For any reason other that the above, the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the Open class for the correct breed, colour sex, weight or height.
- d) If an exhibit arrives late and misses a class, even if it is the only class in which the dog is entered, the dog may not be transferred to any other class.

Certificates were offered for the breed.

POST GRADUATEFor dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate/CACIB/CAC/Green Star or five or more First Prizes at Championship Shows in Post Graduate, Minor Limit,

Mid Limit, Limit and Open classes, whether restricted or not where Challenge

Certificates were offered for the breed.

LIMIT For dogs which have not become show Champions under the Kennel Club

Regulations or under the rules of any governing boy recognised by the Kennel Club or won 3 or more CC/CACIB/CAC/Green Stars or won 7 or more First Prizes in all at Championship Shows in Limit and Open Classes confined to the Breed, whether restricted or not at Shows where Challenge Certificates were

offered for the breed.

OPEN For all dogs of the breeds for which the class is provided and eligible for

entry at the Show.

VETERAN For dogs of not less than seven years of age on the first day of the Show.

BREEDERS For dogs bred by the exhibitor.

NOT BRED BY EXH. For dogs not bred by the exhibitor.

NOT FOR COMPETITION

TITION Societies may at their discretion, accept Not for Competition entries. Societies may accept such entries from breeds of dog not included within the title of the Society and at Shows held over more than one day, such entries ay be accepted on any day from any breed.
