DEFINITIONS OF CLASSES

(The word DOG includes both sexes)

In the following definitions, a Challenge Certificate includes any Show award that counts towards the title of Champion under the Rules of any governing body recognised by the Kennel Club.

Wins at Championship Shows in breed classes where Challenge Certificates are not on offer shall be counted as wins at Open Shows.

In the case of a dog owned in partnership and entered in Members' classes or competing for Members' Specials each partner must at the time of entry be a member of the Society.

In estimating the number of awards won, all wins up to and including the seventh day before the first closing date shall be counted when entering for any class i.e.: **Saturday 1st April, 2023.**

Wins in Variety classes do not count for entry in Breed classes but when entering for Variety classes, wins in both Breed and Variety classes must be counted. First prizes awarded in any classes defined as Special do not count towards eligibility.

If an exhibitor reports before the judging of a class or classes that a dog has been entered which is ineligible, the exhibitor may choose one of the following options:-

(1) **WITHDRAWAL:** The dog may be withdrawn from competition subject to the conditions of Regulation f.(1).19..

(2) **TRANSFER:** a) If a dog is ineligible for a class or classes as regards its breed, colour, sex, weight or height the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the equivalent class or classes for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight or height and, in the event of there being no equivalent class, Minor Puppy and Puppy excepted to the Open class for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight or height.

b) For an exhibit entered incorrectly in a Minor Puppy class or Puppy class, which is over age but under twelve calendar months of age or eighteen calendar months of age respectively, the Show Secretary shall transfer the exhibit to the Puppy class or the Junior class respectively for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight or height and in the event of their being no Puppy or Junior Class to the Open class for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight or height.

c) For any reason other than the above, the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the Open class for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight or height.

d) If an exhibit arrives late and misses a class, even if it is the only class in which the dog is entered, the dog may not be transferred to any other class.

Such breeds may be entered into Imported Breed Register Classes and/or Any Variety or Stakes Classes, with the exception of AVNSC classes, for which they are not eligible. |
| A.V. NOT SEPARATELY CLASSIFIED | For breeds of dog for which no separate breed classes are scheduled. |
| NOT FOR COMPETITION | Not for competition entries will be accepted. Details of each dog so entered must be recorded on the entry form and must be Kennel Club registered. Dogs must be over 4 months of age on the date of the show. |

Introducing our Judges

Jean Singh (Vandamere) - I began to show Border Terriers in 1967 and obtained my affix in 1969. From my first litter I made up my first champion when I was 20 years old. Since then I have made up several UK champions which include Irish Champions and also two champions abroad.

My interest in French Bulldogs commenced 35 years ago and I purchased a fawn bitch from Ann Cottrell from the Quatt affix. I campaigned her and she gained her Champion title.

I award Challenge Certificates in Border Terriers, French Bulldogs and Parson Russell Terriers. I have had the honour of judging Border Terriers at Crufts in 2006 and I am scheduled to judge French Bulldogs at Crufts in 2025. I have also completed judging appointments abroad.

At Driffield Championship Dog Show in 2021 I judged French Bulldogs and was delighted when my CC and BOB winner, at the age of 10 months, went on to win the group then achieve Best in Show. The win made French Bulldog breed history as he was the first Frenchie to win BIS at a general championship show. To top the day off the same Frenchie also won the overall Eukanuba puppy stakes.

I look forward to judging at this show and hope you all have an enjoyable day.

Valerie Atkinson (Raedwulf) – Dogs have always been in my life and my favourites are the Terrier breeds. I currently show and breed Border Terriers and judge a number of Terrier breeds. I love all aspects of the show scene and can be found stewarding and judging at Championship and Open shows across the UK.

Tony Burscough (Kilfinan) - I have owned Bearded Collies since 1987 and Skye Terriers followed a few years later. With my wife Chris I have had 6 UK champions; 4 Irish champions and 4 Canadian champion Bearded Collies plus a number of CC and Res. CC winners. Being busy with the Bearded Collies the Skye Terriers have taken a back seat but we have owned 1 Champion and 2 CC winners. I am approved to award CC's in 3 breeds – I was approved to award CC's in Bearded Collies in 2012 and have also Judged the breed in Canada, Germany and Norway, Portuguese Water Dogs in 2017 and in Skye Terriers in 2021. I am on the B List for Polish Lowland Sheepdogs and Briards.

I have judged Pastoral and Working breeds and their respective groups at Open Show since 2013. I have been involved with Breed Clubs and General Canine Societies over the years, and was past Secretary of the Eastern Bearded Collie Club and am currently Secretary of Rhyl Canine Society. I look forward to Judging at your show will enjoy spending the day with the dogs and see each appointment as a learning opportunity.

Barbara Lawrence (Surreygold) – I got my first heavy coated Wheaten in 2007, and campaigned him and subsequently, his daughter in the UK. Irish coated Wheatens followed, with which I have been very successful in Europe.

Owning both UK and FCI Champion dogs has given me a good insight into the breed.

Debbie Milligan (Greyelf) – I started my showing career in 1994 when I got my first Dobermann and had some success with him gaining his Junior Warrant and his Stud Book number. I got my first male GSP in 2012 and have gained his Stud Book number and my first bitch in 2014 who I won my CC with.

Lesley A Robinson (Lemarli) – I've owned Golden Retrievers for 22 years, six have been shown and give qualified for Crufts, achieving two Res CC's a JW and two SBN.

I started judging at open show level 5 years, ago, it's an honour and privilege to be given the opportunity to judge our beautiful breed.

Bill Shorthose (Candytyke) - I have a lifelong interest in dogs, particularly hounds and terriers, and have judged both groups at Open Show level on a number of occasions. In addition to assessing hounds in a show ring I have been able to see both sight and scent hounds fulfilling their original purpose in the field. I have attended seminars on quite a few breeds, mostly in the hound and terrier groups, and have given breed presentations at home and abroad on my principal breed, the Border Terrier. I give CCs in that breed and have also judged them in various countries in Europe.

Ian Sidgwick (Paulian) – I have been involved in dogs showing since 1973 and have made up champions in our 3 breeds Cavalier King Charles Spaniels, King Charles Spaniels and Miniature L/H Dachshunds and I have been fortunate to have judged in Australia, America, Denmark, Finland, Switzerland and the Czech Republic. I award Challenge Certificates in 9 Toy breeds and the Toy Group at General Championship Shows and I am looking forward to judging the Toy Breeds at this show.

Fiona V Therm (Bryburn/Beldonburn) – I started showing Golden Retrievers in 1974, GSP's in 2000 and have been fortunate to make up Show Champions in both breeds, also having an interest in the working side. I started judging in 1979 and first awarded CC's in Goldens 1987, GSP's 2010. I have served on committees and acted as Secretary, steward regularly and am a mentor for Goldens.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. The Show will open at 9.00 a.m.
2. Dogs will be received at any time but it is the exhibitor's responsibility to ensure that exhibits are available for judging when required.
3. Judging will commence at 9.30 a.m.
4. Exhibits may be removed from the Show after their judging has been completed. The Show will close half an hour after all judging has been completed.
5. Entry fees: £6.00 First Entry per Dog, £1.50 subsequent entries with the same dog. £1.50 Not for Competition. Membership Fees: £4.00 Single; £5.00 Joint.
6. Prize money – There will be no prize money on offer at this show,
7. The Committee reserves to itself the right to refuse entries.
8. Puppies under six calendar months of age on the first day of the Show are not eligible for exhibition.
9. The mating of bitches within the precincts of the Show is forbidden.
10. **BEST PUPPY IN SHOW:** Where a Best Puppy in Show competition is scheduled the Best Puppy in Show is a puppy which has competed and has been declared Best Puppy in Breed, Best Any Variety Not Separately Classified Puppy or Best Any Variety Imported Breed Register Puppy. A puppy is a dog of six and not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the first day of the Show. Where the Best of Breed, Best in Group or Best in Show is a Puppy it may, at the discretion of the judge be awarded Best Puppy in Breed, Best Puppy in Group and Best Puppy in Show respectively. Where the Reserve Best of Breed, Reserve Best of Group or Reserve Best in Show is a Puppy which has only been beaten by an adult dog it may, at the discretion of the judge be Best Puppy in Breed, Best Puppy in Group and Best Puppy in Show respectively. Consequently selection of Best Puppy in Breed, Best Puppy in Group & Best Puppy in Show must follow the selection of Best of Breed, Best in Group & Best in Show respectively.
Best Puppy in Group, and subsequent Group placings must be selected from:
 - a) Those puppies declared Best Puppy in Breed.
 - b) The puppy declared Best Puppy from the Any Variety Not Separately Classified classes in each group or on each day.
 - c) The puppy declared Best Puppy from the Any Variety Imported Breed Register classes in each group or on each day.Best Puppy in Show must be selected from the Best Puppy in Group winners.
11. **BEST IN SHOW:** The dog declared Best in Show is a dog which has competed and has been declared Best of Breed, Best Any Variety Not Separately Classified or Best Any Variety Imported Breed Register.
 - a) Shows judged on the Group System: (Definition; Shows judged on the Group System included classes for breeds within more than one group, as defined in the Kennel Club Regulations B (A); and require a judge to declare a best of each group after which the exhibits so declared will compete for the award of Best in Show and Reserve Best in Show).
 - 1) Best of Breed: Where a breed is separately classified a Best of Breed may be declared but only from those dogs which have received a first prize in a breed class at the show. Where separate classes are provided for each sex of a breed a Best of each Sex must be declared.
 - 2) Best of Group and subsequent placings must be selected from:-
 - a) The Best of Breed winners in each group.
 - b) The Best dog from the Any Variety not Separately Classified classes in each Group or on each day.
 - c) The Best dog from Any Variety Imported Breed Register classes in each Group or on each day.
 - 3) Best in Show: Best in Show must be selected from the Best of Group winners. Reserve Best in Show must be selected from the remaining Group winners following the selection for Best in Show.
12. Exhibits will not be admitted to Group or Best in Show competition after a period of ten minutes has elapsed since the announcement that exhibits are required for judging, unless they have been unavoidably delayed by previous judging not being completed on time, and then only with the special permission of the Show Management.
13. Exhibitors must not pick up dogs by their tails and leads when lifting them nor handle a dog in a manner which causes its feet not to touch the ground when on the move. This is not acceptable. Exhibitors should note that such practice would constitute harsh handling and reports of such practice will be referred to the Committee under Kennel Club Show Regulation F11.
14. All exhibitors must be familiar with Kennel Club Regulation F (Annex B) Regulations for the Preparation of Dogs for Exhibition.
15. All dogs resident outside the UK must be issued with a Kennel Club Authority to Compete number before entry to the show/event can be made. All overseas entries without an Authority to Compete number will be returned to the exhibitor/competitor.
16. **DOGS IN VEHICLES ON HOT DAYS.** Anyone whose dog is entered at a Kennel Club licensed event should take all reasonable steps to ensure the needs of their dog(s) are met, and should not put a dog's health and welfare at risk by any action, default, omission or otherwise. Breach of Kennel Club Regulations in this respect may be referred to the General Committee for disciplinary action under Kennel Club Rules and Regulations. Your dog is vulnerable and at risk during hot weather and the Kennel Club offers the following guidance to help guide you through the do's and don'ts travelling to and whilst at KC licenced events.
 - When travelling to a show please take a moment to consider whether the route to the show is on a busy holiday route, and leave earlier to avoid increased time in traffic jams.
 - If your vehicle is not air-conditioned seriously consider whether travelling to the show is a good idea at all.
 - The vehicle should be as fully ventilated as possible, and plenty of stops should be taken, with lots of water available to drink.
 - Ensure your dog is not sitting in full sunlight. There should be plenty of free flowing air around the dog.
 - When at the show, never leave your dog in the vehicle.
 - Keep the dog in the shade – take your own shade for example a large umbrella and always have plenty of water available to drink so your dog stays well hydrated.
 - Avoid your dog taking part in unnecessary exertion, or from standing in exposed sunlight for extended lengths of time. Remember, if you feel hot your dog is very likely to feel much hotter and dehydrated, and this could lead to dire results. Please look after your dog's welfare.**WARNING: IF YOUR DOG IS FOUND TO BE AT RISK FORCIBLE ENTRY TO YOUR VEHICLE MAY BE NECESSARY WITHOUT LIABILITY FOR ANY DAMAGE CAUSED.**
17. Anyone whose dog is entered at a Kennel Club licensed event should take all reasonable steps to ensure the needs of their dog(s) are met, and should not put a dog's health and welfare at risk by any action, default, omission or otherwise. Breach of Kennel Club Regulations in this respect may be referred to the Board for disciplinary action under Kennel Club Rules and Regulations. The use of pinch collar, or prong collars, is not

- permitted at any show licensed by the Kennel Club. This shall apply at the venue or within the precincts of the show.
18. Not for Competition entries will be accepted. Details of each dog so entered must be recorded on the entry form and must be Kennel Club registered.
 19. No modifications will be made to this schedule except by permission of the Board of the Kennel Club, which will be followed by advertisement in the Canine Press wherever possible.

REGULATIONS FOR THE PREPARATION OF DOGS FOR EXHIBITION F (ANNEX B)

1. These Regulations must be observed when a dog is prepared for exhibition and/or exhibited at any Kennel Club Licensed event. Objections may be referred to the Board for disciplinary action under these Show Regulations and/or for disciplinary action under Kennel Club Rule A11.
 - a) A dog found to have been exhibited in breach of these Regulations will automatically be disqualified from exhibition at the show and from any award gained thereat.
 - b) Unless the exhibitor provides a satisfactory explanation for the dog being exhibited in breach of these Regulations then he/she may be subject to further penalties of either a fine or as listed under Rule A11.
2.
 - a) No substance which alters the natural colour, texture or body of the coat may be present in the dog's coat for any purpose at any time during the show. No substance which alters the natural colour of any external part of the dog may be present on the dog for any purpose at any time during the show.
 - b) Any other substance (other than water) which may be used in the preparation of a dog for exhibition must not be allowed to remain in the coat or on any other part of the dog at the time of exhibition.
3. No act or operation which alters the natural conformation of a dog or any part thereof may be performed except:-
 - a) Operations certified to the satisfaction of the Board.
 - b) The removal of dew claws of any breed.
 - c) Operations to prevent breeding provided that such operations are notified to the Kennel Club before neutered dogs are shown.Nor must anything be done calculated to in the opinion of the Board to deceive.
4. The Board without previous notice may order an examination of any dog or dogs at any Show. Any examination thus ordered will be made by a person having executive authority who shall have a written directive from the Kennel Club in their possession. Samples may be taken for further examination and analysis.
5. An individual has the right to lodge an objection to a dog only if he/she is the owner or handler of a dog competing in the same breed or class. An objection may, however, be lodged by an official of the Show or by anyone so deputed by the Kennel Club. It will be the responsibility of the individual who lodges the objection or the official (as appropriate) to substantiate the grounds for the objection. The Kennel Club will substantiate the grounds for an objection made on its behalf.
6. Any objection by an individual related to an infringement of these regulations must be made in writing to the Show Secretary at his/her office before the close of the Show & the individual must produce evidence of identity at the time of lodging the complaint.

SECURITY AT SHOWS

In light of recent events the Kennel Club would like to issue a reminder to all societies of the importance of security at dog shows. The Kennel Club understand that due to the nature of dog shows and the quantity of paraphernalia exhibitors bring, it would be extremely difficult for show organisers to take on the issue of security alone, therefore we would re-iterate the advice being given by the Police and security services, that everyone in the UK should remain vigilant and this applies to those organising and taking part in dog shows.

The importance of exhibitors feeling that they and their dogs are safe when attending a show cannot be underestimated. We would therefore remind you of the importance of the need for show organisers and exhibitors to remain mindful of potential dangers and that all visitors to shows generally need to be vigilant and alert. Furthermore the society provide robust notification informing exhibitors of where to report to should they see anything suspicious or of concern, and the evacuation procedures in place.

In view of the above, should you see anything suspicious or of concern, please alert the Show Manager, and/or the Show Secretary immediately. If it is a package or bag you are concerned about, please do NOT attempt to move it or examine it yourself.

Should it be necessary for the hall to be evacuated, please remember that evacuation should be carried out as speedily but as safely carried out as possible, as in the case of a fire. It is important that you do not block the exit routes with cages or bags. Please follow any instructions given to you by the Show Management regarding evacuation procedures.
